



- February 2023, established between **UNITE** and the **International AIDS Society**
- Aims to develop a **roadmap for more effective HIV policies**

WORK WITH C-EHRN

 Joint development of a European Policy Network Database for MP to focus on, on several key policy areas: Communicable Diseases, Drug Consumption Rooms, Migration & Drug use

MEDICAL ASSISTED THERAPY CLINICS

- Medically Assisted Therapy (MAT) clinics in Nairobi, Kenya, through PACT Endeleza Program and supported by Hon. Esther Passaris, UNITE Chapter Chair for Eastern and Southern Africa
- Aims to reduce new HIV infections among people who inject drugs (PWID) and provide opioid substitution therapy (OST).

HARM REDUCTION LAW IN KENYA

• Help shaping the new **Harm Reduction Law** in Kenya, which was just recently supported by the Minister of Health;

PARTICIPATION IN THE UN HIGH-LEVEL MEETINGS

• UNITE was invited to participate at the **United Nations HLM**, through which we strengthened the **word of need and urgency** in further commitment and concrete political action;



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HIV infection rates remain stagnant

Despite significant progress in effective treatment and prevention options;

COVID-19 severly disrupted access to HIV/AIDS services




Health systems were unprepared at the time for such pressures, and still aren't;
