PRESENTATION

Few infectious diseases throughout history have had the levels of stigma and discrimination that have accompanied human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). Ending the AIDS epidemic by 2030 is part of the Sustainable Development Goals Agenda and requires the elimination of HIV-associated stigma and discrimination.

For this reason, the elimination of HIV-associated stigma and discrimination is a political priority of the Spanish Presidency of the European Union Council from July to December 2023. This is reflected in the celebration of a High Level Meeting (HLM) on "HIV and Human Rights: Political Action to achieve zero stigma" that will take place on September 15, 2023 at the Real Alcázar in the city of Seville.

GOALS

The objective of this HLM is to address the elimination of stigma and discrimination associated with HIV in order to achieve SDG 3.3 in 2030 in the European Union and within the framework of global health. It will convene 130 attendees from all areas of the response to HIV; EU member countries, international organizations (ECDC, WHO, WHO/Euro, UNAIDS), state, regional and municipal administration, scientific societies and non-profit organizations and civil society.

The results of the HLM will be reflected in its conclusions, based on the technical document "Stigma and discrimination associated with HIV: the challenge".
